And to increase or decrease the font size of words on the slider below it. Tap "Apply" to return to the Visions Menu and save your changes.

Step 8. Tap the arrow "< Back" at the top of the screen to go back to the full list of accessibility options. Scroll and tap "Hearing" to be brought to the audio accessibility options. Note that closed caption and hearing aid options are here.






Step 4. Beneath the subheader "Settings" this is where you will find the different setting you are able to change for accessibility. As an example, click on "Ease of Access Display Settings"

Step 5. To increase the font size of words on your computer, click and hold on the blue rectangle. Slide your mouse back and forth to increase or decrease the size of font. Let go of your mouse button at the size you prefer and click on "Apply" so the change happens across your device.

Step 6. Look at the side menu on the left side of the screen. Here are more options that affect how you see, hear, • • • • and interact with your computer. Explore by clicking and scrolling through the options available to cater your device to your needs.









Apple Computer (aka Macintosh, Mac)

Step 1. Turn on your computer using the button with the power symbol.

Step 2. Once your computer is on, log on to your account.

Step 3. At the bottom of your screen, find the icon that is a gear in a grey box, when you hover your cursor over it it should say "System Preferences" click on it. This is the settings menu.

Step 4. A window will pop up containing the settings for your device. Near the bottom of the window you will find the Accessibility option. The icon will be a stick figure standing in a blue circle, click on it.

Step 5. It will bring you to this window. On the left side in a menu of different accessibility options to explore including "Zoom" which adjusts ways to zoom in the screen. "Descriptions" that gives an audio description of things on your computer. And "Caption" which creates subtitles.

Step 6. As an example, click on "Zoom".

Click on the tiny white box next to the words "Use scroll gesture with modifier keys to zoom". Once selected you will be able to hold down the "Option" button and use two fingers to drag up and down the track pad to zoom in and out. This option only is relevent if you have a laptop or a desktop with an attached track pad.










Step 7. On the side menu, click on "Captions". Click on the white box next to the words "Prefer Closed Captions and SDH" if you prefer to have subtitles when available.


Step 8. On the side menu, click on "Descriptions". Click the white square next to "Play Audio Descriptions When Available", to do so.


Step 9. On the side menu, click on on Speech to adjust the voice that talks. How fast it talks. If you would like what key's you type announced. Or to announce when applications need your attention.

Step 10. Scroll down on the side menu to . When clicking on the "Mouse & Trackpad" there are options to slow how fast the cursor's move. To allow for a slower double click speed. Or to change how fast your computer scrolls if you have scroll wheel on your mouse.

Step 11. On the side menu if you click on the "Keyboard" option. You allow options like sticky keys that has you hold down a key press before inputing. Explore the options available to you to cater your device to your needs!







Youtube

Step 1. Go to the website "Youtube.com"

Step 2. Find a video to watch and click on it, bringing you to the video player.

Step 3. Near the bottom of the video, there will be a white square with the letters CC on it. Click it and closed caption subtitles will appear. It is on when a red line appears beneath it

Step 4. To change the size of the subtitles. Click the gear shaped icon.

Step 5. When the mini menu appears, click "Subtitles/CC"

Step 6. Click "options" it will be underlined and right next to the back button "< subtitles/cc". Here you can change the font, it's size, and it's color by clicking on the corresponding words. If you feel you've changed too much, scroll down and press the reset button.


Step 7. Click the video to make the mini menu disappear.


Step 8. If the video is playing too fast for you. Click the settings gear icon once more and click on "Playback Speed".

Step 9. Speeds 0.75 - 0.25 will slow down your video. Play around with the settings until it feels right!

Common Terminology

Words / Phrases / Slang you will see in reference to the internet

Data: Data is information. Music, photos, videos, documents, etc. This is all

information that computers and phones understand as data.

Upload: To send data / information from your device to another device or the internet.

Download: To save data / information from another device or the internet onto your

device.

Software: Software is a program you download onto your computer or phone. Software

is commonly called app's or applications when on a cellphone. These app's vary in what they do. Calculators, games, social media, messaging, storage. Not all software needs a wi-fi or an internet connection to work. But you need

to be connected to the internet in order to download these programs.

Browser: A web browser is a software application that allows you to access websites

Website: Think of a website as book. Each has different subjects and reasons for

existing. Some give you access to the weather, news, and stores. Other's allow you see thing's other people have created across the globe such as recipes,

novels, and art. You access these websites using a browser.

Some websites may have applications or software you can download onto your

computer or phone for ease of access without having to use a web browser.

Webpage: If a website is a book, then a webpage are the individual pages within that

book. Websites will have many pages within them that are accessed by clicking on highlighted words. Luckily, each page is usually associated with

the highlighted word. Such as "shop", "about", or "contact us".

Interface: The layout of interactive parts on an app, program, website, computer, or

phone. This is also known as a UI. A user interface.

Hyperlink: A hyperlink is a webpage address that is tied to a word or picture, so when it is

clicked it will take you to that webpage. They are often highlighted in a

different color and underlined. Ex: Return to Homepage

Settings: Options that change how programs, applications, and devices work.

Streaming: Temporarily accessing data such as video and music without downloading it.

Install: Downloading items will let your device store the information. Installing will

let your device read them. Phones automatically install applications. While desktop and laptop computers will need additional steps to install software.

Router: A small machine that connects computer and phone devices to Wi-Fi and

internet networks.

The Cloud: A remote storage space for data / information that is accessed through a Wi-Fi

/ internet network. But does not take up any storage space on your device

Mouse: A fist-sized, usually oval device with buttons that connects to your computer

and controls how the cursor moves around the screen. A mouse allows you to

select items with your cursor by clicking.

Monitor: The part of the computer that shows the screen and visual display.


Common Symbols

visual shorthand and icons on the internet



1. Cursor

Found on computers, this tiny black arrow with a white border is what you use to interact with thing's on the computer screen. Click.



2. Pointer

The cursor will turn into gloved hand with a pointing finger when a picture or word contains a hyperlink that will take you to a different webpage.



3. I-Cursor

The cursor will turn into upper-case letter I when you are hovering the cursor over text, or an indication you are able to write or delete text in that area.



4. Settings

The settings application on any device looks like a single gear or set of gears. Very rarely a wrench. This is where you can change things like wi-fi, volume, brightness, etc.



5. Search

The icon to search your phone, computer, browser, or website will have a magnifying glass. Type what you want to search for in the box next to it.



6. Power

The universal icon to turn a device on/off is a C shape rolled onto it's back, with a line coming up through the hole.

Not turning on:

Make sure the charger is working. A phone will indicate that it is charging when a tiny light glows near the top of the phone. If the light is not there, the charger may be loose or not in all the way.

Another reason might be that the wrong button is being pressed. The power button and volume buttons look very similiar and may even be on the same side of the phone. The power button tends to be seperate from other buttons or shorter than the volume button. It could also be on the top or bottom of the phone.

Can't find the application:

The application may not be on the home screen of your phone when you first log in. You may have to swipe left or right on the home screen to find it or tap on application folders. Application folders look like a square with tiny colored squares inside of it.

Needs Password:

If you cannot remember your password but know that one has been set, please identify what kind of password your phone is asking for.

- 1. Number Pin; your phone will prompt you with a numberpad
- 2. Pattern; your phone will prompt you with a 3 by 3 or 4 by 4 set of dots
- 3. Password; your phone will prompt you with your phones keyboard
- 4. Fingerprint; your phone will prompt you to use your finger to unlock your phone
- 5. Face ID; your phone will prompt you to hold it up to your face to take a picture

If you do not have a password you may simply need to swipe again or hit enter without inputting a password or a pin number. If not, try entering a password 3 times. It is also possible your phone was given a simple password such as 0000 or 1234. Often, your device will then prompt you for a secondary way of opening your phone if the password is entered wrong enough times. Such as with your finger/thumbprint or with face ID. You may need to press your thumb to the home button, a button on the back of your phone, or against a button on the side of your phone. Or allow your phone to record your face. If this is still not the case do not try to enter a password more than 5 times or it could lock your phone.

Contact your phone provider as they may be able to unlock your phone remotely.

Using public wi-fi- no sign in screen pops up:

If you are using public Wi-Fi such as from a restuarant, library, or store. While a window should pop up to let you sign into the Wi-Fi network. You might have to manually sign in by clicking on your web browser and attempting to go to a website to intiate the sign in. Even if the Wi-Fi isn't working.

No home button:

Some iphones do not have a home button. Tap the bottom of the screen, press on the bar that appears, and drag it upwards to return to the homescreen of your phone.

If you are needing the home button to sign into your phone, tap the screen, and swipe up from the bottom' you will then be prompted to enter your passcode to unlock the phone, or even use "FaceID" to unlock it.

If you are using an Android phone without a home button, swipe up from the bottom of the screen. A small bar should appear with a circle in the middle. The middle circle is the home button. The shape to the right of that middle circle shows you all the apps you have open if you tap it. And the shape to the left of the circle will take you back to the last page.

How do I get to all the symbols and numbers on the keyboard:

Your phone's keyboard has a button to access things like shapes and numbers. This button will have either numbers or symbols on it such as "1#+" for android phones, or "#+=" for apple iphones. Press it and you will be able to access these symbols. Press the "ABC" to return to the letter page of your phones keyboard.

Wi-Fi has tiny "!" next to it:

The Wi-Fi network is there but the connection is broken. Try unplugging your router for 10 seconds and plug it back in. This soft reset will allow the router to reread the correction and correct it.

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(PC Computer) No globe Icon:

if you have tried to connect to a wifi network before. The globe icon will be replaced with the wifi fan icon.

(Apple Mac Computer) bar at top of screen isn't there:

Drag your cursor to the top of the screen as far as it can go. After a few seconds it should appear.

No power button symbol:

Paint will sometimes wear off a button if used often enough and newer laptops will not mark their power buttons. An unmarked button in the corner of your laptops keyboard or the smooth metal part where the keyboard is embedded may be the power button. Be sure to hold it down for a few seconds.

Desktops power buttons tend to be a large focal button on the skinnier front of the the computer tower.

Old desktop, no wi/fi option:

If you have an older desktop computer, it may not be able to connect to Wi-Fi without a cord. You may need an ethernet cord to directly link your desktop to your router. This is a good option if your older laptop has connection troubles as well.







1. Once you have an ethernet cord and not a phone cord (the two look similar), look to the back of your computer tower or the side of your laptop near the usb ports. The ethernet port looks like a square pyramid and is marked by a symbol of stacked squares connected with lines. The cord will snap in if properly inserted.

2. Connect other end of the ethernet cord to one of the many Lan or Ethernet ports on the back of your router. These ports are usually colored yellow. Do not use the ports labeled internet or wan. Give your router a few minutes before seeing if the connection was sucessful.
